A frigate bird is a bird that many have come to love – and respectfully fear – within the Pacific. It means many things to different islands. It is known as a long-distance traveller that helps with navigation – to see



how far from land you are. A huge bird, with a wingspan of 2.15m, that can cover 223 km before landing. In Samoa, it is an omen. When you see an atafa (frigate bird) you know a storm is coming.

In this play, we explore the world of fa'afafine. A bird of uncertain origin with its own particular storms. We also explore what it is to be different in a complex world that, on the one hand values tradition, and on the other accepts and celebrates a third gender.

A FRIGATE BIRD SINGS has been a great experience for me. Not only in working with these unassuming but very talented writers, Dave and Oscar, but also working with this wonderful cast. Every one of them brings something unique to the production. Every one of them can make me laugh, cry and stop me in my tracks; in awe of their skill and courage.



We have explored musical styles together, teasing out moments and underlining emotions and sometimes just for the hell of it.

I hope you enjoy this insightful play, told with love and care, and that you are inspired to come to the theatre again to hear your own stories and to celebrate the differences we all share.
